Message from the Chair

2024 was a year of focus, growth, and responsiveness for eHLbc. As the need for equitable, evidence-based health information expands across British Columbia and the Yukon, our consortium continues to deliver real value through strong partnerships and collaborative licensing.

I am incredibly proud of the work we have accomplished this year. We've strengthened our infrastructure, renewed critical core and opt-in resources, and ensured that health knowledge remains accessible to frontline care providers, students, researchers, and educators. We've supported members through significant changes, including the closure of the CPSBC Library and its withdrawal from the Core Suite, and worked to mitigate impacts while advocating for consortial needs.

The launch of BC's first new medical school in more than 50 years at Simon Fraser University, the growth of rural medical training, and the urgent need for credible research in an era of misinformation all underscore one thing: the demand for robust, shared health information services is stronger than ever. Together, eHLbc is ready to meet that need with resilience, innovation, and an unwavering commitment to equitable access for every community we serve.

Strengthening Licensing Infrastructure

eHLbc's main objective is to ensure equitable access to vital online health resources for BC's and Yukon's healthcare and post-secondary communities. Ensuring the smooth operation of consortial licensing infrastructure is crucial to achieving this goal.

2024 Accomplishments:

- Renegotiated a 3-year license for ConsortiaManager (with 30% discount) via Consortia Canada.
- Completed the upload and reorganization of 100% of eHLbc license documents into ConsortiaManager.
- Negotiated low inflationary increases for EBSCO renewals in partnership with Western Consortia.
- Trained two UBC iSchool co-op students in e-resource licensing and renewal workflows.
- Posted all "Tip of the Month" emails to ConsortiaManager as reusable training aids.



Core Suite: Access to Key Health Resources

The Core Suite is a foundational, multi-year collection of essential health resources that all eHLbc member organizations can access, providing significant value to the entire consortium.

2024 Accomplishments:

- Renewed the Core Suite's 10 databases (including CINAHL Complete, MEDLINE, LWW Total Access, and PsycINFO).
- Mitigated financial impact from the College of Physicians and Surgeons of British Columbia (CPSBC) Library's closure:
 - Recovered outstanding payments.
 - Renegotiated pricing to reduce budget shortfall.
- Initiated Core Suite Renewal (2026-30):
 - Formed a Core Suite Team.
 - o Conducted a member-wide input survey.
 - Presented commitment plan at fall Management Committee meeting.

Growing Opt-in Resources

eHLbc leverages the collective subscription power of its member organizations to secure substantial discounts on health information resources.

2024 Accomplishments:

- Renewed 16 opt-in resources, including:
 - Clinical Skills (Elsevier), (also negotiated a 5-year extension for the license, beginning Dec. 31, 2025).
 - JBI Tools, PsychiatryOnline, DSM-5, SPORTDiscus, and others.
- Partnered with Consortia Canada, COPPUL, and BC ELN to coordinate and strengthen several licensing agreements.
- Completed a feasibility review of top-ranked products from the most recent Product Selection Process, culminating in a detailed outcomes report.
- Initiated a review of the internal product selection workflow to streamline the process and improve responsiveness to member needs.

Stronger Together

eHLbc is an active participant in Consortia Canada, a group of library consortia that cooperatively licenses electronic resources and works on common goals. In 2024 eHLbc collaborated with fellow Canadian consortia to:

Secure low common inflationary renewal rates on EBSCO-licensed resources.

License electronic resources on behalf of members.

Negotiate a three-year term for ConsortiaManager — software used to manage licensing infrastructure — at a 30% discount.

Empowering & Supporting Members

The eHLbc Administrative Centre provides ongoing support and advocacy to member organizations.

2024 Accomplishments:

- Acted as a communications hub for <u>EBSCO UI changes</u> and concerns among members:
 - Compiled shared feedback and updates.
 - Liaised between the vendor and member organizations.
 - Hosted a watercooler peer support session.
- Launched an eHLbc Orientation Course (30-minute asynchronous module).
- Held virtual launch with ~20 attendees.
- Responded to queries from: Nurses and Nurse Practitioners of British Columbia, Michael Smith Health Research BC, Provincial Nursing & Allied Health Council, and Adams Lake Indian Band Health Centre.



More than licensing alone, eHLbc actively supports the professional growth of its members. eHLbc recognizes that knowledgeable, skilled library staff are vital to a resilient health information ecosystem. Alongside expert training sessions and peer-to-peer learning opportunities, eHLbc maintains a growing archive of webinars available on-demand, ensuring that staff across all member organizations can build and share expertise whenever they need it.

Looking Ahead: 2025 Priorities

Priorities for the consortium include:

- Finalizing the Core Suite 2026-2030 agreement.
- Improving the New Product Selection process.
- Expanding asynchronous and peer-led learning.
- Continuing to support resilient, cost-shared licensing infrastructure.
